The American Association for Cancer Research (AACR) is accredited by the Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education (ACCME) to provide continuing medical education activities for physicians.

How do attendees apply for credit?

All individuals requesting continuing medical education credits must complete a CME Request for Credit Survey that will be sent via e-mail to all attendees and will also be available on the website.

Who can receive CME credits for attending the meeting?

Physicians (M.D. and D.O.) can receive a CME Certificate by submitting a CME Request for Credit Survey. Non-physicians may request a <u>Certificate of Participation</u> by completing a CME Request for Credit survey. Participation hours in this educational event may satisfy licensing requirements for certain specialties.

How do attendees apply for Maintenance of Certification points?

Participation in a CME activity enables the participant to earn American Board of Internal Medicine (ABIM) Maintenance of Certification (MOC) points equivalent to the number of CME credits claimed for the activity. To receive ABIM MOC, participants must request MOC in the CME Request for Credit Survey and complete all questions. Once these steps are completed, AACR will submit your completion information via the ACCME's Program and Activity Reporting System for the purpose of granting MOC points.

What is the deadline for submitting a credit survey?

Evaluation surveys and CME credit requests must be received by Sunday, December 29, 2024.

When will I receive my CME Certificate or my Certificate of Participation?

Your certificate will be e-mailed to you approximately 7-10 days after you complete the Request for Credit survey.
